Prose: Fiction, non-fiction, memoirs, personal essays, one-act plays, dramatic monologues and book excerpts of up to 3000 words. Translations may be included as long as translator is responsible for copyrights/permissions/fees.

"I Remember Tributes," 500 words maximum.

"Tributes" can be submitted in addition to poetry or prose.

All submissions must be unpublished and may be in English, Italian or French.

Conference Theme:

Italian-Canadian Literature: Departures, Journeys, Destinations

The Association of Italian Canadian Writers (AICW) is accepting proposals for its 16th biennial conference to be held in Padula, Italy, from May 5 to May 8, 2016. Inspired by the location of the conference which combines the slow pace of tradition and history with the fast-paced urban moment, this conference seeks to bring together academic papers and literary readings that engage with the themes of physical, aesthetic, and symbolic mobility and change in Italian-Canadian literature and culture.

Writers and artists, academics and researchers from all disciplines are invited to submit proposals to present creative or critical works in Italian, English or French. Graduate students are particularly encouraged to participate.

Possible topics include, but are not limited to:

- Engaging with tradition in contemporary contexts;
- Social and cultural mobility within English/French Canada;
- Writing and transmitting cultural memory;
- Representations of place, space, and (dis)location; and
- Italian diaspora and globalization.

For panels and individual presentations of 20 minutes, please send 200-word proposals and biographical information (60 words). For literary readings of 15 minutes, please send a 200-word excerpt of the text to be read (prose or play) or four poems (max. 40 lines) along with biographical information (60 words). Preference will be given to readings and performances of new works.


The deadline for all proposals is August 15, 2015.

On April 26, during the Blue Metropolis Montreal International Literary Festival, the AICW and editors Giulia De Gasperi, Maria Cristina Seccia, Licia Canton and Michael Mirolla launched Writing Cultural Difference with readings by Ralph Alfonso, Caterina Edwards and Terri Favro. A unique volume of fiction, nonfiction, poetry and scholarly essays, Writing Cultural

Difference is a welcome addition to Canadian literary studies. The publication of this volume certainly dispels the belief that Italian-Canadian writing was a passing phenomenon three decades ago. "Italian-Canadian writers have so much left to say – so much more to write and a lot more

Licia Canton is the author of the short story collection Almond Wine and Fertility (2008). She is a literary translator and founding editor-in-chief of Accenti Magazine. She has published anthologies of creative and critical writing, including Conspicuous Accents (2014). She mentors emerging writers through the Quebec Writers' Federation. She holds a Ph.D. from Université de Montréal and an M.A. from McGill University.

Giulia De Gasperi was born in 1976 in Treviso, Italy, and currently lives in Summerside, PEI. She received a

BA (Laurea, 2002) in Foreign Languages and Literatures and a PhD (Dottorato di ricerca, 2007) in Anglo-American and Iberian Studies both from Ca' Foscari University, Venice, Italy. She is Vice-President of the Association of Italian Canadian Writers (AICW) and Board Member of the Italian Canadian Archives Project (ICAP). She is a literary translator and editor.

Michael Mirolla's publications include three novels: *Berlin* (2010 Bressani Prize winner), *The Facility*, and *The Giulio Metaphysics III*; two short story collections, and three collections of poetry, including *The House on 14th Avenue* (2014 Bressani Prize winner). His short story collection, *Lessons in Relationship Dyads*, is forthcoming from California's Red Hen Press in the Fall of 2015.

Maria Cristina Seccia is a lecturer in Italian Studies at Bangor University (UK), where she completed a PhD in Translation Studies in 2014. Her doctoral thesis explores the link between the notion of cultural translation and Italian-Canadian literature from a practice-led perspective. It has her own Italian translation of Caterina Edwards' *The Lion's Mouth* as the main case study.

New Poetry Book by George Amabile

George Amabile's new book of poems, *Martial Music*, has been accepted by <u>Signature Editions</u>. It will be **published in 2016**.

Venera Fazio's Poetry "A delight to read"

A selection of Venera Fazio's poetry was published in the recent *Encompass 1V Anthology*, The Ontario Poetry Society, edited by Mark Clement. Venera was one of six poets highlighted. The other contributors are Howard Freedlander, Joanna Gale, Rhonda Melanson, Catina Noble and Stella Mazure Preda.

In her review, to appear in the fall edition of Verse Afire (Sept. 2015), K.V. Skene tells us: "Born in Sicily, Venera Fazio lovingly embraces her roots, her parents and her extended family. Regarding her mother she (Venera) writes: "Mom would never know/how much she was loved/how depression deceives."

Skene also says the author deals "unsentimentally with hardship and death in a tribute to her grand-mother" who was: yearning to join Domenico/with candle in hand/brightening the darkness of the other side.

"Her poems are intimate, direct," adds Skene: Nonna Venera/is the cautionary namesake I invoke/whenever I am tempted/to strike.

Skene describes as a "delight to read:" My grand-daughter tells me what I need to hear./She knows me better than I thought.

Carmelo Militano, author of *Sebastiano's Vine*, calls *The Sicilian Wife* by Caterina Edwards "a compelling read from start to finish."

The thriller, published in April, is available online and in bookshops across Canada.

"Edwards has created a multi-layered, dark novel full



of the heat and light of the Sicilian landscape in contrast to the cold Canadian urban winter," says Militano. "Out of each landscape the determined desires and destinies of two women cross: Fulvia, the Mafia princess, who has sought to escape and live in her own fairy tale; and Marisa, the police chief who wants to shine cold light on the naked truth and unravel the complicated and compromised murderous past."




