This month we are launching Behind Barbed Wire:

Creative Works on the Internment of Italian Canadians and Beyond Barbed Wire: Essays on the Internment of Italian Canadians – a co-publication with Columbus Centre. I thank my co-editors Domenic Cusmano, Michael Mirolla and Jim Zucchero for their diligent work, as well as the contributors for their co-operation. I'd also like to acknowledge the work of Venera Fazio, Anna Foschi, Agata De Santis, Giulia De Gasperi, Sayeeda Alibhai and Columbus Centre's Lucy Di Pietro and Louanne Aspillaga.

The last few months have been very intense. As you may recall, the Association of Italian Canadian Writers, in partnership with Guernica Editions and *Accenti Magazine*, received a grant from Canadian Heritage – under the Community Historical Recognition Program (CHRP) – to produce two books and a series of magazine articles on the internment of Italian Canadians during the Second World War. Several articles appeared in Issues 23 (Fall 2010) and 24 (Winter 2012) of *Accenti Magazine*. The companion volumes *Behind Barbed Wire* and *Beyond Barbed Wire* and Issue 25 (Spring 2012) of *Accenti* will be launched across Canada: Vancouver (March 6), Montreal (March 16), Ottawa (March 18), Halifax (March 24) and Toronto (March 31). 



F.G. BRESSANI LITERARY PRIZE DEADLINE: April 2, 2012

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Submissions are accepted from Canadian citizens or permanent residents, 16 years of age and older, with at least one parent or grandparent who was born in Italy (except for the category CREATIVE NON-FICTION which is open to people of any ethnicity).

Submissions are accepted in any of the following categories:

POETRY: Collections of at least 20 poems, published between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2012. FICTION: Novels published between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2012.

SHORT FICTION: Short stories and novellas (of at least 8,000 words) published between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2012. Single entries only - collections and essays are excluded and will not be accepted. CREATIVE NON-FICTION: Memoirs, travel writings and essays (of at least 8,000 words) on Italian themes, published between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2012. Single entries only - collections are excluded and will not be accepted. NOTE: the CREATIVE NON-FICTION category is open to people of all ethnicities EMIGRATION FROM ITALY: This special prize is offered by the "Regione Lazio Cultural Society of BC" to Italian-Canadian writers of non-fiction (e.g. memoirs, biographies, autobiographies, essays, etc.) on the theme of "Emigration from Italy". Entries must have been published (as a book, in a journal or as part of a collection) between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2012.

Authors can submit works written in Italian, English or French (translations are not eligible).

Each entry must be accompanied by its own original application Form downloadable at

http://iccvancouver.ca/wp-content/uploads/Bressani-2012-Application-Form.pdf.

Entries must be submitted in 6 copies (two copies for the readers, three copies for the judges and one copy for the library of the Italian Cultural Centre).

Each author can submit no more than 3 works in total for all categories.

A writer can win only one prize per category, and each text may be submitted to only one category. Manuscripts will not be accepted.

There must be only one author per entry.

No entry fee is required.

Submissions must be sent or delivered in a sealed package with the original application form to the following address, and must be received no later than April 2, 2012:

The judges reserve the right to reassign to another category an entry that doesn't fit properly in the category indicated in the application form. Entries which do not qualify for any of the categories will be disqualified. Submitted works will not be returned.

WRITERS' UNION OF CANADA WRITING FOR CHILDREN COMPETITION DEADLINE: April 24, 2012

The Writers' Union of Canada is pleased to announce that submissions are being accepted until April 24, 2012 for the 16th annual Writing for Children Competition. The winning entry will be the best Canadian work of up to 1,500 words in the English language, fiction or non-fiction, written by an unpublished author.

PRIZE: \$1,500 for the winning entry, and the entries of the winner and finalists will be submitted to three Canadian children's publishers.

ELIGIBILITY: This competition is open to all Canadian citizens and permanent residents who have not been published in book format in any genre and who do not currently have a contract with a book publisher. Original and unpublished (English language) fiction or non-fiction is eligible.

HOW TO SUBMIT ENTRIES:

- Entries should be typed, double-spaced, in a clear twelve-point font, and the pages numbered on 8.5 x 11 paper, not stapled. Do not send entries that only have a few sentences per page.
- Illustrations are not accepted.
- Submissions will be accepted by hardcopy only.
- Include separate cover letter with title of story, full name, address, phone number, email, address, word count & # of pages of entry.
- Please type the name of the entrant and the title of the entry on each numbered page. This is not a blind competition.
- Make your cheque or money order payable to The Writers' Union of Canada. Multiple entries can be submitted together and fees can be added and paid with one cheque or money order, \$15 per submission.
- Entries must be postmarked by April 24, 2012 to be eligible.

Results will be posted at www.writersunion.ca in July 2012. Manuscripts will not be returned.


Giardinu d'Amuri By Rosanna Lo Presti Joie De Plume Books


