The Association of Italian Canadian Writers F.G. BRESSANI LITERARY PRIZE 2022 EDITION

Goals

The main objectives of the F.G. Bressani Literary Prize are to inspire and recognize the literary production of works by Canadian authors of Italian origin. We seek to celebrate the richness of the Italian-Canadian experience by recognizing and honouring the literary expression of Canadian authors of Italian heritage.

Submission Guidelines

The Bressani Literary Prize is awarded to the Italian-Canadian author of the best eligible literary work in four categories: Fiction (novels, novellas, collections of short stories), Poetry, Non-Fiction (essays, memoirs, travelogues) and First Book. eBooks and self-published books are eligible. Submissions must be first editions.

Submissions are accepted from Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Italian ancestry. Authors must be 18 or older.

Submitted works must be written in Italian, English, French or Italian dialect. (Translations are not eligible.)

Works must be published between January 1, 2018 and April 30, 2021.

The entry fee for each submission is \$ 40 to cover administrative costs. Go to <https://aicw.ca/donate/> or send an e-transfer to treasurer@aicw.ca or include a personal cheque payable to AICW with the application.

For each category, each submission must include 4 copies of the book. eBooks should be submitted in ePub or .mobi format and **will only be accepted if there are not copies in paper format**. Submitted works will not be returned.

An author can submit only one book.

Each submission must be the work of a single author. No co-authored books; no edited books or anthologies.

Submissions must be sent or delivered in a sealed package along with the application form to the following address and must be received no later than May 30, 2021.

Selection and Adjudication

The winner in each category receives \$1,000 and a certificate.

Finalists receive a one-year AICW membership and a certificate.

For each category, a three-member Jury will select three finalists and then choose the winners. The Jury's decision will be final.

Finalists in each category will be publicized one month before the Jury announces the winner.

The AICW and the Jury will not be responsible for issues arising from any alleged plagiarism in the winning works.

In the case of insufficient or inadequate entries, the prize will not be assigned in one or more categories. The decision of the Jury in this respect is final.

All the participants are invited to attend the award ceremony. Winners are encouraged to attend or to delegate a person of their choice to accept the prize.

The award ceremony will be held in the second half of 2022; the exact date and location will be released when the finalists are announced. Neither subsidy nor reimbursement is available for travel or accommodation expenses.

Background and History

[The Italian Cultural Centre](#) in Vancouver established the biennial F.G. Bressani Literary Prize in 1986, accepting the proposal brought forth by the late C. Dino Minni and Anna Foschi Ciampolini. The creation of the Bressani Prize coincided with the City's Centennial celebrations and the launch of the First National Conference of Italian Canadian Writers held in Vancouver. In 2020, the Italian Cultural Centre relinquished all rights to the Association of Italian Canadian Writers which is now the sole manager and organizer of the F.G. Bressani Literary Prize.

The Bressani Literary Prize honours and promotes the work of Canadian writers of Italian heritage. It is named after the Jesuit Fr. Francesco Giuseppe Bressani, an Italian Jesuit missionary, born in Rome in 1612 and the author of "Breve Relatione" who is the precursor of Italian-Canadian writing.
